EXCLUDING EMPLOYEES FROM THE COUNT

How It Works

An exclusion line is a tool for discounting staff from the traffic.


If the object crosses an exclusion line, it will not be counted whether it was crossed before or after any other counting tool.

A specific path is created for the employees depending on the peculiarities of the location and on the needs of the workers.

An example of using exclusion lines: on the left, in a place agreed upon by the staff, an exclusion line is placed; when going in or out of the store, the employees must go through the agreed areas and cross the exclusion line (orange line).



There can be two exclusion lines set up — this way it will be harder for a customer to get excluded from the count. An object will not be counted if crosses both lines in any order (see the diagram below).



Note: the lines are set up in the counter's web interface, they are not visible onsite.

Blue arrows — employee tracks
Red arrows — customer tracks
Orange lines — exclusion lines
Pink lines and the rest — tools for counting people going in and out
